

How Much Do You Know About Skiing?

1. Ski comes from the word 'skíð,' which is a Norwegian word. It translates as "split piece of wood."

2. The first downhill ski race was held in Sweden in 1879.

3. Skiing has been a Winter Olympic sport since 1924. Nordic skiing was the only discipline in those early days. It wasn't until 1936, at the Garmisch-Partenkirchen games in Germany, that downhill skiing was introduced.

4. In 2016, Italian Ivan Origone clocked a top speed of 254.95 kph (158.4mph). The speed skier broke his previous record while wearing an aerodynamic suit and helmet that reduced wind resistance. He broke the record in Var, France, on a specially prepared slope that allowed him to charge in a straight line to go as fast as possible. Speed skiing is a very niche discipline and is the fastest non-motorized sport on land.

4. In 2016, Italian Ivan Origone clocked a top speed of 254.95 kph (158.4mph). The speed skier broke his previous record while wearing an aerodynamic suit and helmet that reduced wind resistance. He broke the record in Var, France, on a specially prepared slope that allowed him to charge in a straight line to go as fast as possible. Speed skiing is a very niche discipline and is the fastest non-motorized sport on land

5. Archeologists have found skis that date back to 8,000 BC. The two-meter-long skis were found in Central Asia, were made from wood, and covered in horsehair.

6. Sir Arthur Conan Doyle not only created Sherlock Holmes, but he was a keen skier too. He was instrumental in convincing the English-speaking world to take up the sport. He wrote several inspiring articles in The Strand Magazine that promoted the Swiss Alps as the best place to go skiing.

For our second trip of the year we'll head out west to California and Mammoth Mountain. We'll fly into Reno, Nevada (RNO) where we'll board a motorcoach to take us to the resort after a grocery stop.

We'll be staying at the <u>Juniper Springs Condominiums</u>, located near the Eagle Express Lift and Eagle Lodge at Mammoth Mountain Ski Area. All condos are 2-bedroom/2-bath and offer king / twin twin bedding.



The resort has been ranked #1 in the annual Conde Nast Traveler's Reader's Choice Survey in 2013, 2014 and 2015.


